Our passionate and tenacious staff is committed to nourishing our community by helping local, small and limited resource farmers in accessing increased market opportunities to our diverse range of customers, but especially to those experiencing food insecurity.

Now more than ever, we need your support in financial giving to carry out this mission. In 2023 alone we...

- Purchased and distributed 237,530 pounds in local farm fresh products from 45 farmers through the Food Hub
- Increased our farmer sales by 10% from previous years
- Reached a total of 3,502 customers between the Food Hub and Local Motive Mobile Farmers' Market
- \$172,976 in sales going directly into farmer's pockets and 71,570 pounds nourishing our food insecure community members through our food access programs Local Motive Mobile Farmers' Market and Farmers Fighting Hunger
- Launched our Food Prescription voucher program in partnership with Novant Healthcare, seeing a 85% redemption rate
- Launched the inaugural Farmer Scholarship program, benefiting 17 small to midsize farmers



#### THE FOOD HUB

Located in Burgaw, NC, the Food Hub connects local, small-to medium-scale, limited-resource farmers with new year round market opportunities and access to education and technical assistance. It is Feast Down East's heartbeat, serving as a national model for a GAP certified, wholesale aggregation center for farmers while facilitating food distribution for all of our programs.

If you have shopped or eaten out in Pender or New Hanover counties, chances are you have tasted the seasonal, local food brought to market by Feast Down East. Our reach includes Whole Foods and Tidal Creek Food Co-op; restaurants such as, Pinpoint, Savorez, Benny's Big Time Pizza, Manna, The Green House Restaurant; institutions such as New Hanover County Dept of Social Services and UNCW Campus Dining; and food relief agencies like Farmers Fighting Hunger, who have the opportunity to feed their patrons at no cost.




#### THE MOBILE MARKET

The Local Motive Mobile Farmers' Market (Mobile Market) brings affordable, locally-sourced, nutrient-dense foods directly into communities with high levels of food insecurity. Since 2018, the Mobile Market has distributed over \$250,000 in fresh, local products, sold at significantly reduced costs.

Found at **20 different sites**, as well as at numerous pop-ups with community partners, across **Pender and New Hanover Counties**. The Mobile Market provides a unique model that closes the food system circle, expands purchasing power, and addresses limited healthy food access **providing patrons with dignity in their food choices**.

#### **OUR VISION**

Since 2006, Feast Down East has cultivated Southeastern North Carolina's regional food system by connecting farmers with local communities.

Feast Down East's core values ensures our vision of building a more resilient and equitable food system.

To do this, in 2024 we will accomplish:

- Food For All: Serve 10 new Mobile Market sites, increasing greater access to high quality, fresh foods for our low-income neighbors.
- Advocacy: Work with Cape Fear Food Council, cultivating local government support for Fresh Bucks-doubling SNAP purchases at the Mobile Market.
- **Resiliency**: Farmers will be able to **store** thousands of pounds of cold product at the Food Hub, opening up new wholesale markets and alleviating storage burdens for small farmers.
- **Economic Vibrancy**: Grow new market channels for small and medium sized farmers, increasing farmer sales by at least 15%.
- Social Justice & Equity: From ensuring that low-resource neighbors can access healthy food to providing scholarships to 15+ historically-disadvantaged farmers, we will build a better local food system for everyone.
- **Leadership**: Through in-depth analysis of our region's infrastructure and capacity, Feast Down East will lead Southeast NC to a healthier, economically-vibrant regional food system.

#### THE WHY

North Carolina agriculture is the third most diverse agriculture-based state in the United States and brings over \$76 billion annually to the state's economy. However the local farming communities in NC have faced ever-growing challenges, including:

- Increased inflation leading to increased input
- Extreme weather patterns causing unpredictable growing seasons
- Market instability as processing facilities and customers close their shops.

Feast Down East recognizes the infrastructure and logistic barriers that small- to mid-sized farmers experience, especially those who have been historically marginalized and underserved. These injustices are witnessed from farmers to consumers as seen by:

- 98% of Feast Down East farms being located in a Low Income/Low Food Access Census Tract
- 1 in 5 children in New Hanover County are food
- 30% of food insecure families do not qualify for SNAP benefits because they fall slightly above the poverty threshold

#### **CULTIVATING RELATIONSHIPS**

A key to the success of Feast Down East lies in our commitment to connect and cultivate regional food economies through partnerships, strengthening the regional food system. Enhancing these collaborative relationships is imperative in continuing to bolster and sustain transformative programs reflecting community needs, desires, and autonomy in accessing healthy foods.

In August-September 2023, Feast Down East and Food Bank of Central & Eastern NC collaborated in conducting a Community Engagement Survey, assessing specific food-related needs in the Southside community of Wilmington, NC. Producing a number of profound findings regarding regional food insecurity and the importance of programs such as those at Feast Down East, with:

- 83% of participants experienced food insecurity in the past two months (as measured by the Hunger Vital Signs)
- 93% of people reporting 2+ barriers to a healthy diet were food insecure.
